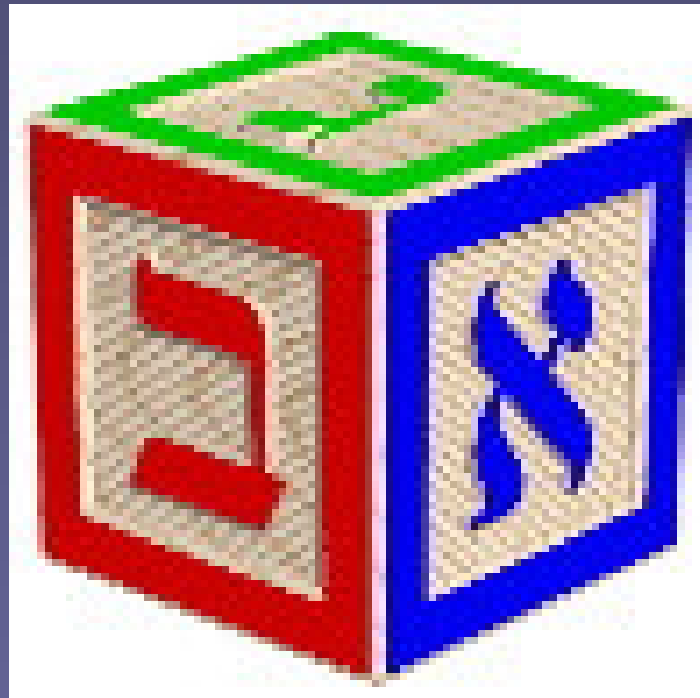

alephbet!**



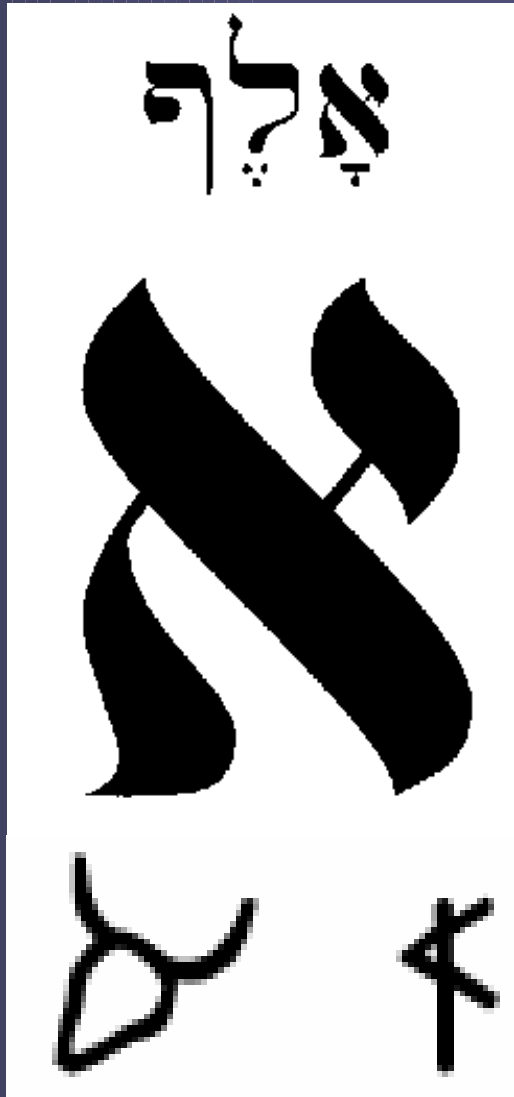
In the aleph bet:

Aleph is the first letter.

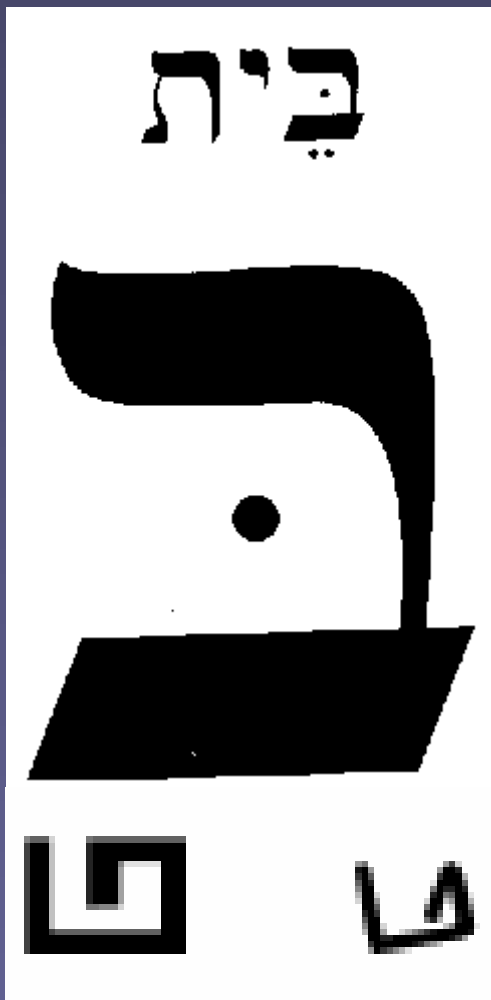
Bet is the second letter.



The aleph speaks to us about the oneness of YHWH. It gives us a picture of Y'shua as the Savior and YHWH as the Creator. It is the number "one" and becomes one with its surrounding letters or vowel points.

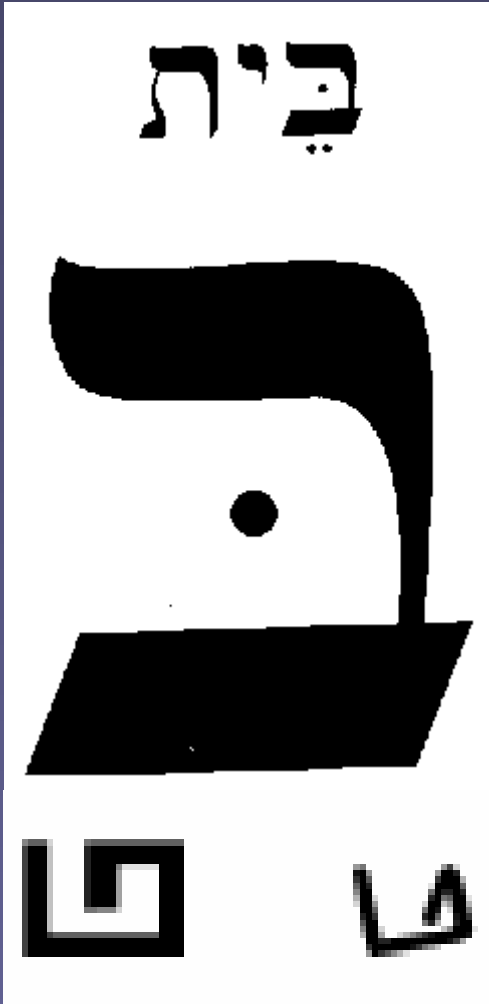


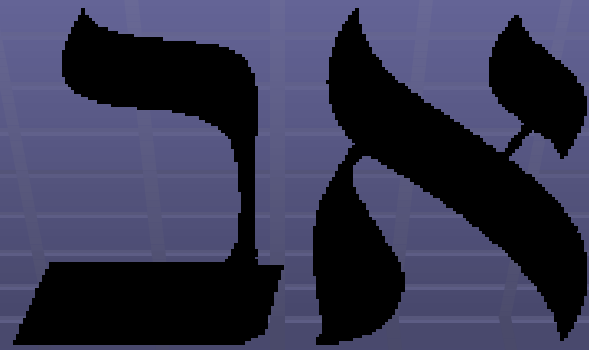
The bet has the 'B' sound when a dot is in the middle of the letter. When there is no dot, it is called a 'vet' and has a 'V' sound.



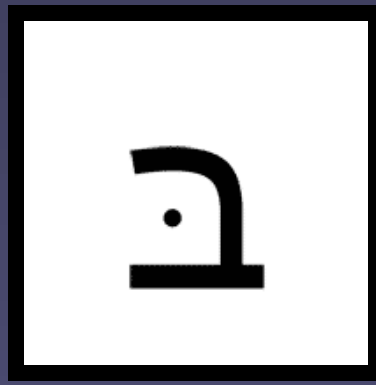
**The bet is symbolic  
of the books of  
Exodus and Mark.**

**The first letter of  
the Torah is the  
Bet.**



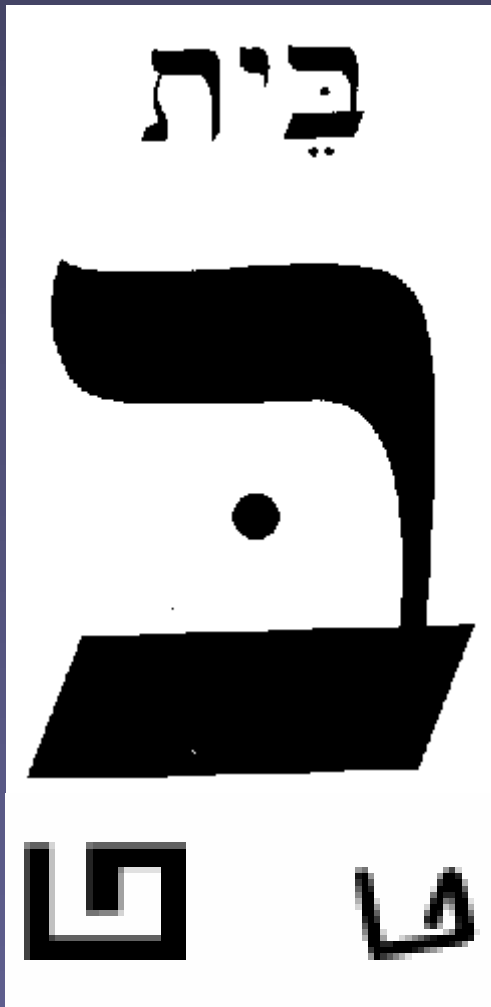


**The alef is the number 1.  
YHWH is one. But, YHWH  
did not want to be alone.  
He wanted to produce  
Himself. YHWH the alef  
created the Bet.**



**As a prefix, the letter bet may function as a preposition meaning "in", "at", or "with".**

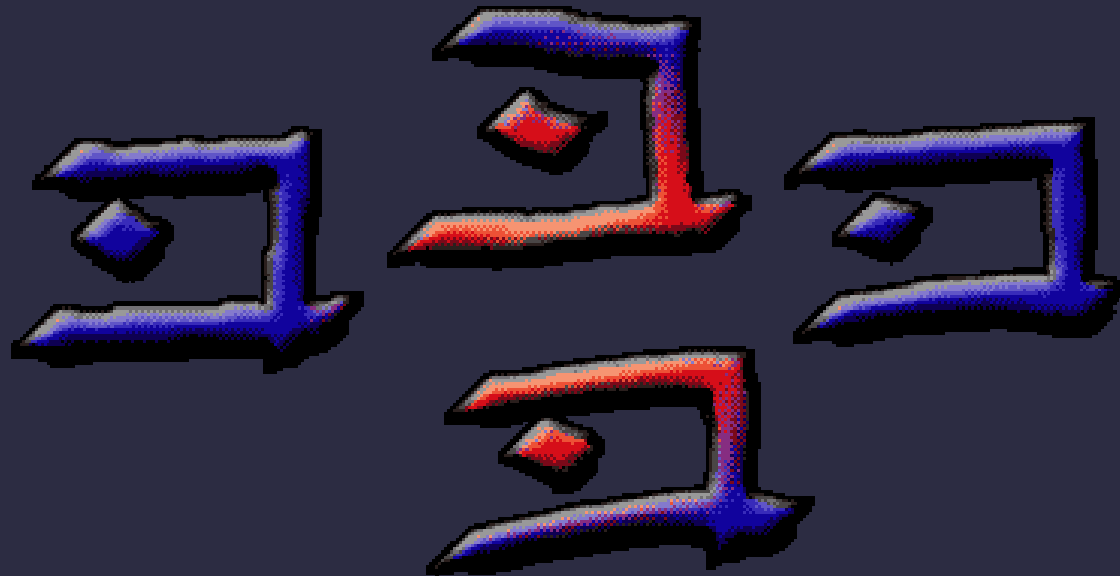
**For example, the Hebrew word "ba-midbar" means "in the wilderness"**

behind the Hebrew letters...

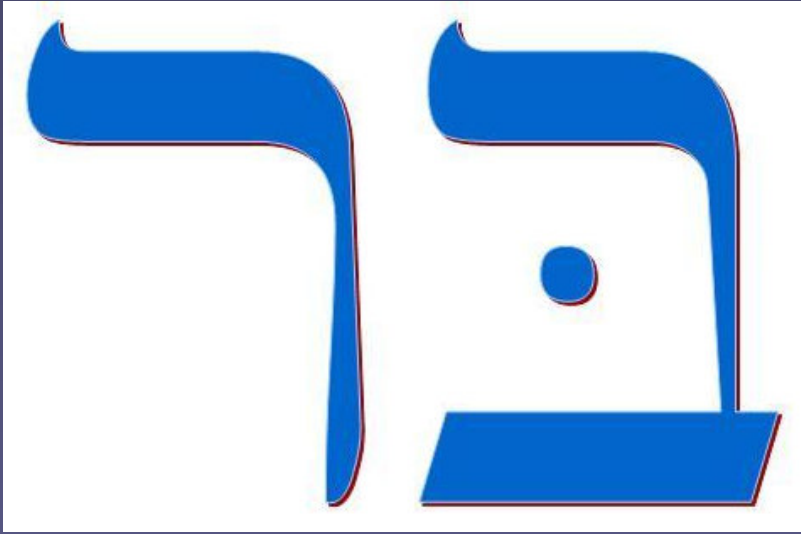


The Hebrew word for “created”  
is “bara.”

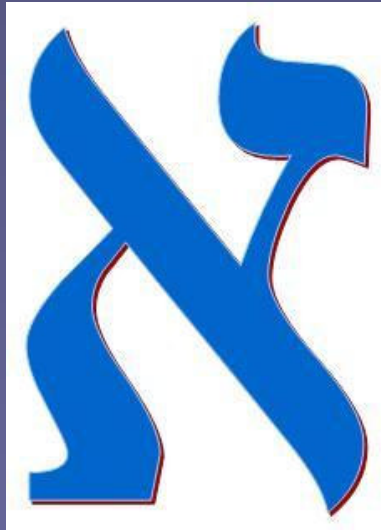
In Hebrew this is bet - resh - aleph



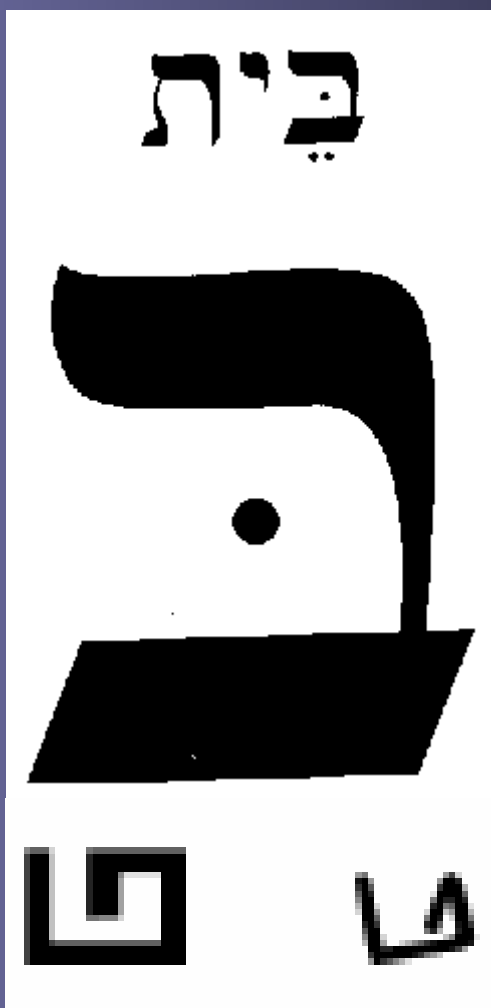
These words confirm the passage

Hebrew for “son”

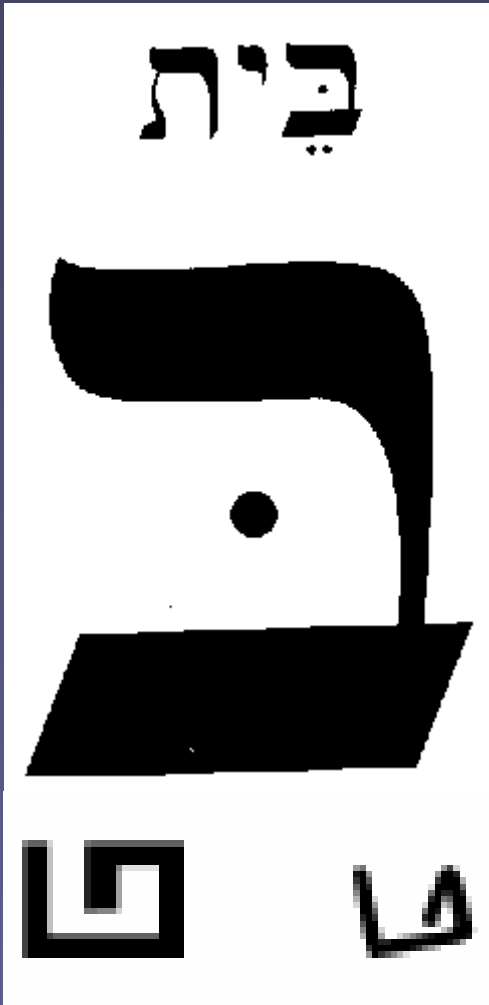


In the beginning

of Aleph!

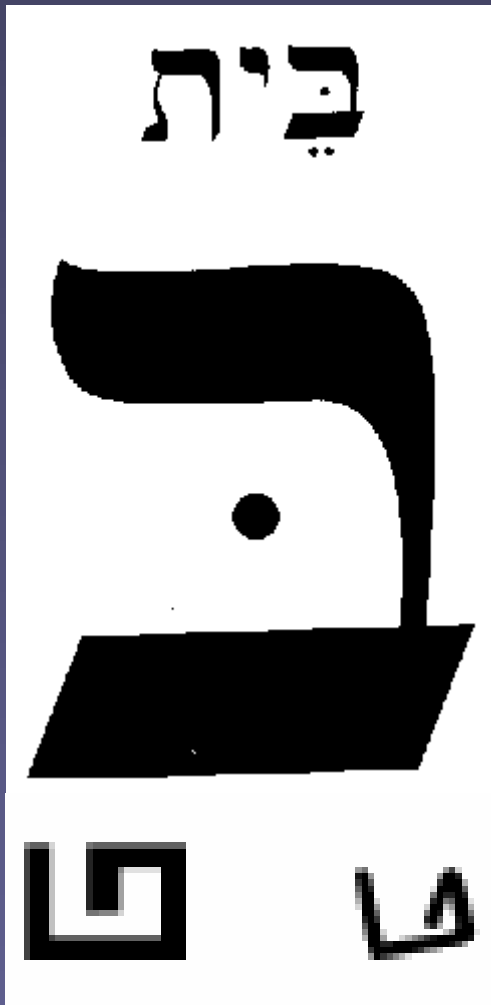


The bet is a picture of a house. Every creature blesses YHWH with the bet saying, “Blessed is YHWH forever and ever,” Psalm 89:53.

We create a dwelling place for YHWH through our praise. “Let them construct me a sanctuary, that I may dwell among them,” Exodus 25:8



The purpose of creation continued with Torah, the Temple, and Y'shua.



“The Word (ben elohim) was made flesh and dwelt among us.”

**In Exodus YHWH rescued Israel from the house / bayit of bondage. He later commanded the nation to build Him a house / bayit.**

**The bet is exemplified in the book of Exodus. Two important “bet” words appear in Exodus 1:1.**



**“Now these are the names  
of the children (ben) of  
Israel, which came into  
household (bayit)  
came with Jacob,”  
Shemot / Exodus 1:1**

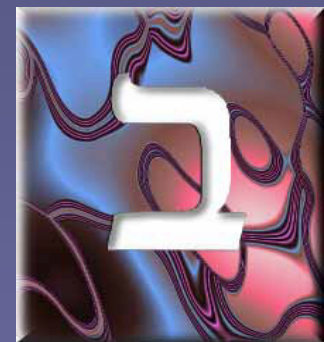


**Ben – Bayit  
Son – House**

**“And thou shalt say unto  
Pharaoh, Thus saith YHWH  
Israel is my son, even my  
firstborn: And I say unto  
thee, Let my son go, that he may  
serve me: and if thou refuse to let  
him go, behold, I will slay thy  
son, even thy firstborn,”  
Exodus 4.22**



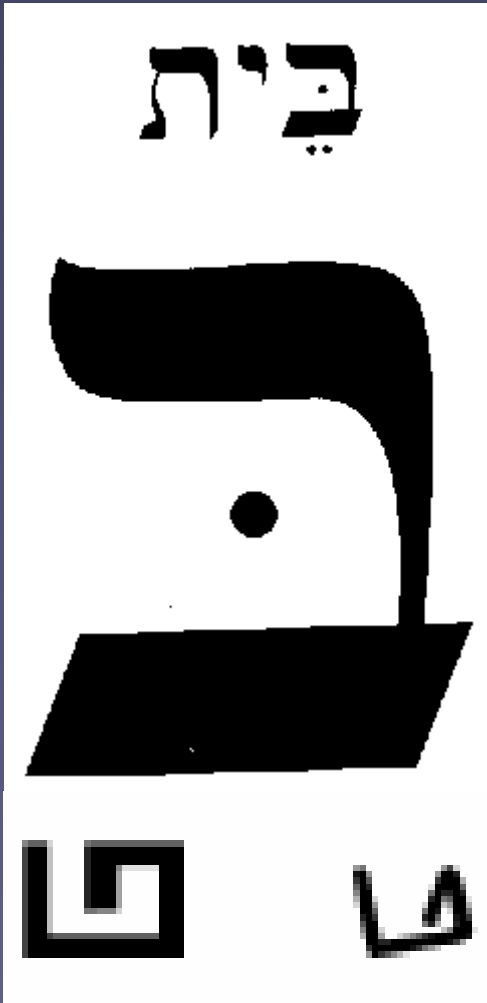
**“The first of the firstfruits of thy land thou shalt bring unto the house of the YHWH thy Elohim. And YHWH said unto Moses, Write thou these words: for after the tenor of these words I have made a covenant with thee and with Israel. And he wrote upon the tables the words of the covenant, the Ten Commandments,”  
Exodus 34:26.**



**The word bayit means  
“house.”**

**We are His house -  
His dwelling place.**

**We are now the bayit,  
the bet of YHWH.**



“Beit Yisrael is built upon the foundation of the shlichim and neviim, Y’shua ha Moshiach Himself being the Rosh Pina; In whom all the bayit being joined together grows into a kadosh Beit HaMikdash in YHWH: in whom you also are being built together as the Beit HaMikdash of YHWH through the Ruach,” Ephesians 2:20-22

“Do you not know that your body is the Beit HaMikdash of the Ruach Hakodesh which is in you, which you have from YHWH, and you are not your own? For you are bought with a price: therefore bring tifereth to YHWH in your body, and in your ruach, which are from Him,”

1 Corinthians 6:19

**A midrash says that all the letters appeared before YHWH to appeal why they should be the first letter of Torah. The bet was chosen because through it all of creation can bless / barchu YHWH.**

# YHWH can't praise Himself!

**This is why YHWH created the  
Bet and why YHWH created the  
universe! Through  
b'racha / blessings we can  
build a bayit / house to YHWH  
and His ben / son.**

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# Principles from the Bet:

**The Bet is the number 2.**

**2 is the symbolic number of  
strength and confirmation**

***Revelation 11:3-4, "And I will give power unto my two witnesses, and they shall prophesy clothed in sackcloth. These are the two olive trees, and the two candlesticks standing before YHWH."***

***"Two are better than one; because they have a good reward for their labor," Ecclesiastes 4:9-12.***

**“One witness shall not rise up  
against a man for any iniquity,  
or for any sin, in any sin that  
he sinneth: at the mouth of two  
witnesses, or at the mouth of  
three witnesses, shall the  
matter be established,”  
Deuteronomy 19:15**

**"On the evidence of two witnesses or three witnesses, he who is to die shall be put to death; he shall not be put to death on the evidence of one witness," Deuteronomy 17:6**

**Y'shua sent out His disciples "two and two" in Luke 10:1.**

# Principles from the Bet:

There are 2 key points to learn  
from the Bet:

1) YHWH wants to bless us

2) We return His blessings with  
blessings

“YHWH bless you, and keep you:  
YHWH make His face shine  
upon you, and be gracious to  
you: YHWH lift up His  
countenance upon you, and give  
you shalom,” *Numbers 6:25-26*

“Blessed be YHWH Abba of our  
Master Y’shua ha Moshiach, who  
has blessed us with all spiritual  
brachot in the shamayim in  
Moshiach,” *Ephesians 1:3*

# Principles from the Bet:

**There are things that block  
YHWH's blessings.**

**We must remove the  
hindrances of uncleanness,  
the world, curses, negativity,  
unbelief, and demons.**

# Principles from the Bet:

**We create a bayit / house for YHWH when we bless Him and bless others! We are to be a pipeline of blessings from YHWH to other people!**

“YHWH be merciful unto us, and  
bless us, and cause His face to  
shine upon us; that Thy ways may  
be known upon the earth, Thy  
saving help among all nations.”

(KJV) , ” *Psalm 67:1,2*

“For I was hungry, and you gave me something to eat; I was thirsty, and you gave me drink; I was a stranger, and you invited me in; naked, and you clothed me; I was sick, and you visited me; I was in prison, and you came to me,” *Matthew 25:35-36*

# Principles from the Bet:

**We are part of the common wealth of Israel. Our “wealth” should be commonly shared between others.**

**“Remember that you were at that time separate from Y’shua, excluded from the commonwealth of Israel, and strangers to the covenants of promise, having no hope and without YHWH in the world,”**

*Ephesians 2:12*

– living letters of Hebrew.**



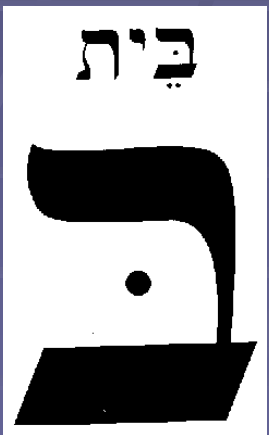


**We don't need to search for signs of the Savior. Instead, we can learn much from the Hebrew letters!**
